This major tournament spanning three weekends is our final and largest tournament of the year. The first two days (September 7 and 8) are 36 holes of low net (or low gross) with 18 holes played each day. The lowest combined score in each flight will win the Medalist award for that flight. The top eight players in each flight will be seeded for match play that will take place over the following weekends. The finals of each flight will occur Saturday, September 21. With the exception of the championship flight, all match play will be 18 holes with handicap strokes.

All participants with an index of 7.0 or lower will automatically play in the *championship flight*. The championship flight will play gross scores, not net. In addition, the championship flight final match will be 36 holes rather than 18. The final winner of the championship flight will be the 2002 SMGC Club

Champion. Jay Dameron is the 2001 defending Club Champion.

NOTE: Any player with an index over 7.0 may declare himself to be in the championship flight, but this must be done before play begins on September 7.

The club championship awards dinner will be September 21 at the Sunnyvale Golf Course. The awards for the tournament will be announced and handed out that evening, in addition to many wonderful door prizes for you and your guest. There will be a raffle as well, so be prepared!
